HOW TO COLLECT YOUR MEDALS

1. Travel the bus line to your destination
2. If there is a medal collection point there, go to the counter and show them your **BEE Card**
3. Every child traveling can claim a medal for the bus line they've just traveled on
4. If there is no medal collection point, travel back to the Frankton Bus Hub and see the Lightfoot team to claim your medal
5. If you can't collect your medal on the day, email info@lightfoot.org.nz

QUEENSTOWN'S TREASURE TRAILS

Treasure Trail 1a to Fernhill - Views and a Bush Walk

Jump on a #1 to Fernhill, get off just before the Fernhill Grocery store and claim your medal, walk back to the Fernhill playground and have a picnic. If you're feeling energetic walk back to Queenstown via Cameron Place to Thompson Street OR walk down Fernhill Road to the lakeside. These are easy, downhill walks suitable for all ages.

Treasure Trail 1b to Remarkables Park - Playgrounds Galore

Ride the #1 to Remarkables Shops, get off outside Wakatipu High School or in Remarkables Park. Claim your medal from Frank's Eatery. Head over to the Red Barn Playground or the Remarks Park Playground for lunch and a play. If you're feeling adventurous, head to Game Over, Site or Base Camp at Red Oaks Drive.

Treasure Trail 2a to Arthur's Point - Tranquil Waters

Jump on a #2 to Arthur's Point, get off at Arthur's Point (Coronet Hotels) and collect your medal from Rakau. Walk down to Atley Road and access the Morningstar Reserve via Redfern Terrace for a short bush walk and views out over the Shotover. Not keen for a bush walk? Why not try Strike Bowl for an indoor alternative?

Treasure Trail 2b to Arrowtown - Busy Little Town

Catch the #2 to Arrowtown, alighting in the town centre. Head to the Lakes District Museum to collect your medal. Visit the Museum, stroll the main street or follow the Arrow River for a beautiful bush walk... hint, there's an amazing rope swing after the first bridge... just try not to get wet!

Treasure Trail 3 to Kelvin Heights - Beaches and Balls

Ride the #3 to the end of the line at Kelvin Heights golf club. Relax on the safe and sheltered swimming beach, take an hour for the easy walk around the golf course (avoid the balls!) and take snaps of the amazing sculptures, hello Mr Goat!. Visit the Clubhouse at the top of the hill for a snack or drink. Still have energy? Make your way to the huge Flying Fox, playgrounds and tennis courts hidden in Jardine Park. Claim your medal back at the Bus Hub.

Treasure Trail 4 to Hanley's Farm - Best Playground in Queenstown?

Jump on the #4 to Jack's Point, but alight at Hanley's Farm playground. Enjoy the spectacular view (is it better than Fernhill's?!) and challenge yourself on the outdoor equipment. Why not bring the kids' scooters to test their skills on the amazing pump track? Yes, you can take a scooter on the bus! Claim your medal back at the Bus Hub.

Treasure Trail 5 to Lake Hayes Estate - Scooter's Paradise

Ride the #5 to Lake Hayes Estate, and jump off at Nerin Square. Grab a snack/drink at the Deli, and head to the playground to enjoy all it has to offer. Lakes Hayes provides a perfect training ground for scooter-riders as it has flat, wide streets and an amazing pump track. Set up your own race zone, or bring your basketball to enjoy the courts adjacent to the playground. Claim your medal back at the Bus Hub.
